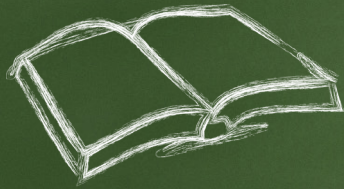
If this sounds like an investment that you are looking to protect, consider these tips as we make our way into spring:

- Remove any dead or dying trees on your property to avoid any accidents

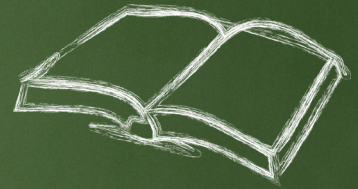

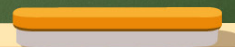
JoJo's CORNER
